
Stop the rapid increase in the Precept*

My name is Simon Langman

I'm a keen cyclist

lovely countryside for cycling locally. I moved to Debden from Saffron Walden with my wife and two children (now adults) in 2006. I quickly volunteered to help in village life, working in the village shop for 18 months and cutting the grass at the Church. My family also enjoy supporting the village.

During 2016, in the absence of support for a new village hall, a risk of losing the generous Army grant emerged. I led a group of residents to come up with a proposal to build on the current site, a hall in keeping with other buildings in the vicinity; succeeding in achieving a plan, supported by both a majority of residents and the Village Hall Trust (VHT), securing planning approval in six months. We raised additional funds via generous pledges from residents meaning that there was no need to resort to huge public loans/debt, or demolition of the pavilion, which the football club had volunteered to renovate. The VHT then withdrew their support.

Having attended most Parish Council (PC) meetings over the last four years, I have become extremely concerned at how the current PC conduct meetings and record minutes. Healthy debate and residents' questions and/or concerns to the PC have sadly now been stifled. Questions can be sent in 48 hours before a meeting, but the Parish Clerk is not allowed to read these out. These questions are often not addressed, even after the meeting. Due to reasonable questions remaining unanswered, residents have had to resort to requests under the Freedom of Information Act. Some residents have been banned from asking questions for six months or more. Being a Councillor is challenging. I believe those in public service must demonstrate

high standards and transparency, working in the public interest and not for selfinterest. The PC adopted the Code of Conduct including the Nolan Principles of Public Life, (Selflessness, Integrity, Objectivity, Accountability, Openness, Honesty and Leadership), I believe all those in office should follow this code. I am passionate about transparency and will strive for this if you elect me. I will ensure all residents have a voice and will work to bring our community together. Some will remember the 'Debden Strawberry Fairs' and regular fetes with children enjoying Fancy Dress arriving by decorated tractor and trailer, dog shows, the straw bales around the 'arena' and dancing at dusk to a local band. Such events build community cohesion, not to mention raise precious funds.

The Parish Council must set high standards and be transparent & inclusive in working for our community. Everyone has the right to be heard. Your opinion matters. I will listen. I will act.

I've decided to stand as a candidate for Debden Parish Council, because I want the Parish Council to get back to a form of normality, reduce politics and cut unnecessary waste of our funds.

Council Tax precept

Debden has come through the Covid Pandemic and like the rest of the country the combination of Brexit and the war in Ukraine has created massive increases in food and fuel cost which has impacted and changed the lives of everyone. Meanwhile, the precept percentage of our Council Tax has been increased from £15,000 to £56,000. If elected, I will return this to a more affordable level. I will also

ensure that voters will know exactly where all the money has gone over the last 4 years and will be more vigilant and careful on how the money is spent going forward.

Future of our Post Office

We run the risk of losing our Post Office due to increased costs in energy fuel. Arthur Davey is working to raise funds by hopefully setting up a 100 Club lottery. Debden Community Residents' Group have donated £520 along with £158 money raised by those who took part at The Progressive Supper organised by Jane Langham and Margaret Andrews. The Parish Council have yet to contribute but have recently spent £1000 on plans of the allotments! I believe saving our Post Office should be more important!

Debden developments

I'm concerned that there have been several developments in Debden not least the Thaxted Road 26 houses which was refused initially as over 40 residents and the PC opposed it. However, on advice from our District Councillor this has now gone to final approval which is concerning as there is now plans to build 9 bungalows on the other side of the village.
